### **College of Saint Mary -Fast Facts**

- Enrollment around 1,000
- All female undergraduate institution
- Male and female graduate programs
- Student mothers make up 10-15% of the enrollment any given year
- Graduation rate for student who identify as single mothers at the college is 68%.
- The college is located in Omaha, Nebraska-population around 510 thousand (Omaha Proper)
- Founded in 1923 by the Sisters of Mercy



### How it all began... Student Parent Success at CSM

- 2000 the Mothers Living and Learning program started out in an academic building with three women and their children.
- 2012 the director of Single Parent Success was created to assist Residence Life with MLL-combined role
- 2013 the opening of Mothers Living and Learning, Madonna Hall –donor funded
- 2013 Director of Single Parent Success created as one role/separated from Residence Life serving all single mothers attending the college
- 2021 Single Parent Success became Student Parent Success and continues to collaborate with residence life to provide services and resources to the residential student mothers





# Mothers Living and Learning Program



### Qualifications

#### **Old Qualifications**

- Age limit 35 years old
- Number of children 2
- Ages of children 6 wks 10 yrs
- Required to have roommate
- Full-time student (12 credits)

#### **Current Qualifications**

- Age limit removed
- Number of children 3
- Ages of children 6 wks 12
   yrs by time of graduation
- Roommate optional
- Full-time student (12 credits)



### Amenities within Building/Program

- Suite-style living for student mothers and their children
- In-suite full bathroom, living area, bedrooms, and kitchenette
- Access to kitchens, dining areas, and free laundry facilities
- Food pantry within building
- Access to on-campus meal plan for student parent and children
- One-price room and board plan
- Free parking on-campus and WiFi
- Supervised playtime two three times a week.














# Steps for Acceptance to Program

- First apply and be accepted to College of Saint Mary as a full-time undergraduate student
- Meet the qualifications for the MLL program
  - Undergraduate, not married, 3 children, full time student
- Complete an MLL application
- Complete an MLL interview

### **Application**

- Electronic Form
- Application
  - Student information
  - Emergency Contact Information
  - Child Information
  - Additional information
- Application Reviewed by MLL Staff; if accepted contacted regarding scheduling interview



### **Interview Process**

- Interview is scheduled for 1 hr with DRL, ADSSS, MLL Committee Member
- Interview questions cover
  - Expectations of College Life
  - On Campus Living/Engagement Expectations
  - Resiliency
  - Parenting & Resources
- Scoring Matrix (scale of 1 -3) to measure 14 different categories.
  - Must receive a minimum score of 32 to receive acceptance to the program



## Specific Policies/Concerns within Building


- Emergency contact for both parent and child are required
- Comfort within the building
- Non-MLL caregiver
- Remain open during normal college closures
- Readiness of students to be in college
